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General Reactions

After receiving immunizations some children may experience reactions which are usually mild in nature. Such reactions include:

- ✓ Low grade fever and fussiness for 24-36 hours following immunizations.
- ✓ Tenderness and swelling at the injection site.
- ✓ A firm, painless knot at the injection site which may persist for up to a week following immunizations.

Immunizations are a vital component to a child's good health and are one of the major reasons for decreased childhood mortality. Current immunization certificates are required by the state of Kentucky for all children entering daycare, preschool, kindergarten, sixth grade, and high school.
